#### The source text:

Concerning the choice of **relative adverbs** or **pronouns**, the **relative adverbs**, "where", "when" and "why" can be used for *location*, *time*, and *the reason* for something happening, respectively. All can be replaced by "that" in **defining** relative clauses, but when "where" is replaced by "that" (or "which") an extra preposition must be added to the sentence. We use "which" for things and "who" is used for people, and in **defining** relative clauses "that" is also always possible. Remember, it is **not** possible to use "that" in a **non-defining** relative clause.
